Lluís Bonet is a professor of applied economy at the University of Barcelona, specializing in cultural economics, cultural policies and arts management. Dr. Bonet is a Coordinator of the <u>Master of Cultural Management</u>, President of the PhD programme on Cultural and Heritage Management, as well as the Director of the <u>Professional training Program on Cultural Management</u> at the University of Barcelona, consisting of 5 part time courses (*Master in Cultural Management; Diploma in Cultural Policies and Management; Diploma in International Cultural Management and Cooperation; Diploma in Cultural Tourism;* and Diploma in Performing Arts Production).

Lluís Bonet has been research fellow at the *Massachusetts Institute of Technology* and invited professor at the *Université de Montpelier*. He has been invited lecturer in over 30 different countries in Europe, the Americas, Africa and Asia. In 2002 he won the Research Prize of the Catalan Audiovisual Council with a research on The Audiovisual industry faced to the digitalitzation process. In addition Dr. Bonet serves as 'the President of the Juree of the *Cultural Policy Research Award* founded by the European Cultural Foundation and he is a member of the Board of the <u>Association of Cultural Economics International (ACEI)</u>.
